VIII. MATTERS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

A. UPDATE ON FY21 AND 22 ANNUAL AUDITS

Mr. Kippenbrock introduced Emily Oster, City of Santa Fe Finance Director.

Ms. Oster said we are moving forward with FY21 and 22. Our external auditor is working on FY21 procedures with staff. Our consultant auditors are moving forward. We are on track to submit FY21 on June 30th. On FY22 and 23 we are working with the auditors to close out the year end. Staff was tracking last week on closing procedures.

Mr. Kippenbrock said we will have an audit report for FY21. He, our Chair and Commissioner Hansen will be meeting to review that. We are starting to do FY22 entries.

Commissioner Hansen asked when will we be able to separate SWMA and BDD from the City.

Ms. Oster said that is a complex question. There are elements of the Joint Powers Agreement that describe different structures. We do report payroll for SWMA separate from the City. We do have dedicated funds for SWMA and BDD.

Commissioner Hansen asked what about separate bank accounts from the City for cash so we are not dependent on the City for that information.

Ms. Oster said we can separate out cash and bank accounts. As far as separating that, that is more complex. Based on accounting standards and rules, SWMA does not meet the qualifications as a separate government entity. Changes to the organization's structure would be necessary. That does not mean we can't have separate accounts within the accounting structure.

Commissioner Hansen asked so we have to be under the City or the County.

Ms. Oster said yes. The City is the fiscal agent so that makes sense.

Commissioner Hansen asked if Ms. Oster was working towards more separation.

Ms. Oster said yes. We are interested in doing that. You already have separate funds. You cannot be audited separately. It may be helpful to talk to the auditors about that for more explanation.

There was continued discussion around structures and how entities are created.

Mr. Kippenbrock said most solid waste with Joint Power Agreements are structures similar to our structure.

Ms. Oster said the exit conference for the FY21 audit will be on June 28th.

Commissioner Hansen asked when will it be for FY22.

Ms. Oster said we already working on it. The auditors will continue their work. Our goal for FY23 is December 15th. In order for that to happen, FY22 will have to be completed before that. We are thinking September or early October. That is a rough estimate. If FY 23 is completed by December 15th, it would be on time.

Commissioner Hansen said she wants to see us all be fiscally sound.

Mr. Kippenbrock reported that the BuRRT re-roofing project will be complete by Friday. The CID inspector will be out before the end of the month. We will close out the project by June 30th. At our last Board meeting we talked abut sending our grinder machine out to the NE/SE Connector project to mulch green waste from the new road area. He met with Public Works on the 6th. We will be sending out grinder out on the 26th to begin working. There are three large piles. We estimate that it will take two weeks to grind the material.

Mr. Kippenbrock introduced Thomasina Chavez, the new SWMA accountant saying she started on Monday.

IX. MATTERS FROM STAFF - AGENCY, CITY, COUNTY

A. DANITA BOETTNER, P.E., LANDFILL MANAGER, SANTA FE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AGENCY

Ms. Boettner reported on amnesty days saying that they finished the green waste amnesty days and received just short of 100 tons over four weekends. We had fewer participants this year. The County loads were heavier than the City on average. The next Trash Amnesty Day will be on September 16th.

B. SHIRLENE SITTON, DIVISION DIRECTOR, CITY OF SANTA FE ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES DIVISION

Ms. Sitton reminded everyone that the City offices will be closed on Monday so there will be no trash or recycling on that day. Everything shifts a day. July 4th is a Tuesday. Monday collections will not be effected. Tuesday collections will move to Wednesday and so on. We will be running radio ads on the schedule. Our residential

services calendar is available. We have a free recycling chat you can download on your phone. We are starting down the road for the next rate increase. There will be a public hearing on the rates on June 28th, then the rate increases will go before City Committees and before Governing Body on July 26th. We have a very large auction for City items on Saturday, June 17th. We have 8 - 10 solid waste vehicles in the auction. It will be held on the corner of Camino Estrada and Meadows. You can see the items on Bentleysauction.com.

Commissioner Hansen asked Ms. Sitton if she had reached out to Espanola and Rio Arriba County.

Ms. Sitton said no, but she will do that. She will work with Randall.

Chair Garcia asked if items don't sell what is that next step. Are they donated.

Ms. Sitton said she didn't know all the rules on that. It is run by the Finance Department. Donating vehicles would go through the Governing Body.

C. LES FRANCISCO, SOLID WASTE SUPERINTENDENT, SANTA FE COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS

Mr. Francisco said we keep plugging along. We are starting to get new hires. Espanola reached out to him this morning so we are in communication.

Mr. Francisco said we are going to pick up the mulched material from the NE/SE Connector project and will take it to our convenience centers so that it is available free to the public.

Mr. Kippenbrock said on July 1st will be the third four rate increases. It will be \$2.50 per ton for solid waste and a few more. We started notifying accounts in May.

X. MATTERS FROM THE BOARD

Council Rivera said at our next meeting or by email would you send out the rate increase and the percentage the City pays of tipping fees etc.

Mr. Kippenbrock said of the five entities, the City of Santa Fe is number 1. Santa Fe County is number 6. Santa Fe pays 50% of the tonnages. They are the largest user.

Councilor Rivera asked for a breakdown of the top 6.

Mr. Kippenbrock said it is in our formal audits. He will get that for him.

SWMA

Commissioner Hansen said sometimes private haulers pick up in the County as well.

Mr. Kippenbrock said Santa Fe has a County Ordinance regarding waste pick up and recycling. There are contracts with haulers. Private haulers are doing collections outside the City limits.

Commissioner Hansen said that was part of the annexation agreement.

Chair Garcia asked if Caja del Rio is open on Juneteenth.

Mr. Kippenbrock said no they are not. We need to update our personnel policies and Union contract to celebrate that.

Commissioner Hansen said the County is closed as well.

Chair Garcia said there will be no meeting in July.
